Dear Friends,

It's been four months since we last connected with you from the Carolinas. Time to write again.

Becky's work in the SIM USA Medical office (2 days a week) and her studies (3 days a week) are going well. Unit 2 in Pharmacology was a bit of a scare when there was so much to learn and lots of math. But she did her best, Harold tutored her in math, we sent out an urgent call for prayer, and God enabled her to pass. Praise the Lord. Becky is now in unit 10 out of 13. At the rate she has been going recently, she should be finished with her course work the end of October. Then she'll be doing 80 hours of clinical in the local hospital here in Rock Hill, South Carolina. She found out this past week that it will involve 12 hour days. **Please pray that Becky will finish her studies well and have strength for her clinical.**

The first job awaiting Harold when he arrived in the SIM USA office was to help everyone transition from using Office 2000 on their computers to Office 2003. Harold's part was to identify issues involved in the transition and to do training on what was different. (If you're interested, you may ask for the set of notes Harold prepared.) After the transition, Harold focused on catching up on all that had happened with the Theological Education projects in Ethiopia while he was "out of the loop." And as final preparation for the 2006-2007 school year, Harold spent the first three weeks of August in Ethiopia setting up the scholarships for the new school year. There is still much to be done. It is difficult doing all of this long distance by e-mail, but there is currently no one else in Ethiopia who can do it. **Pray for Harold as he handles Theological Education projects from a distance. Pray for guidance in hiring an Ethiopian employee to take on these responsibilities. Praise for the safe and very profitable trip that Harold had to Ethiopia in August.** Harold was even able to visit the new Ministry Training College campus being built in Hosanna (about four hours from Addis Ababa).

At Manchester Creek Community Church, our church here in Rock Hill, we have decided to be involved in the English as a Second Language (ESL) ministry with internationals in the community. Harold will be assisting the director and Becky will be in charge of refreshments. **Pray for us to be God's ambassadors each Monday evening to the people who come for English teaching.**

Pray for us also to be God's ambassadors in our neighborhood. We try to walk once a day for exercise and have met many of our neighbors. Also, we have become fairly good friends with our Indian neighbors next door. We tried on many occasions to have them over to our house, but they were just too busy preparing for the August 19 wedding of their daughter. Now that that is past, **pray that we can get together.**

Praise the Lord with us that several new financial supporters have joined our team. Pray that God will provide the remaining \$600 month that we need.
